

## INL hosts receptions

They described their priorities as "safety and environmental stewardship, taking care of our people, and mission accomplishment."

At facilities on the INL site and in Idaho Falls, Battelle Energy Alliance leaders shook hands with their new co-workers and spoke with confidence about the challenge ahead.

"This new mission to lead a national renaissance in nuclear energy and build a world-class national laboratory means change, not just from the top, but from each of you within the organization," John Grossenbacher, INL director, told employees. "All of us need to stop watching and waiting, and join together to contribute to this effort because we have lots to do and ten years is not a long time."

The INL director and leadership team stressed the importance of approaching work and daily activities safely.



"We are happy to be here, and are excited about our shared opportunity to build a world-class national laboratory," Grossenbacher said. "We need each and every one of you to accomplish our mission. Each of us needs to discipline ourselves to drive carefully and be patient because nothing is more important than coming home safely to our families each day."
